

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
ON AIR SERVICES
BETWEEN THE AERONAUTICAL AUTHORITIES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF
THE REPUBLIC OF MAURITIUS AND
THE GOVERNMENT OF ICELAND

1. Delegations representing the aeronautical authorities of the Government of the Republic of Mauritius and the aeronautical authorities of the Government of Iceland (hereinafter referred to as the 'Contracting Parties', the 'Parties' or the 'Party') met in Bali, Indonesia, on 18th November 2014, to discuss air services between their respective countries.
2. The discussions were held in a friendly and cordial atmosphere. A list of the members of the two delegations is attached as per Appendix I.

3. AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT (ASA) TEXT

Acknowledging the importance of the air transport sector and its contribution to the economic and social development of both countries, the delegations agreed on the text of a draft Air Services Agreement ('the draft ASA') as per Appendix II.

4. The following understandings were reached between the delegations:

4.1 DESIGNATION OF AIRLINES

Each Contracting Party shall have the right to designate one or more airlines for the purpose of operating the agreed services on the routes specified in the Annex to the draft ASA.



4.2 ROUTE SCHEDULE

The designated airlines shall be permitted to operate the agreed air services on the specified routes as per the Annex to the draft ASA.

4.3 FREQUENCY / CAPACITY

(a) Passenger

The designated airline of each Contracting Party shall be allowed to operate up to seven weekly frequencies in each direction per week on the specified routes using any aircraft type.

(b) All Cargo Operations

The designated airline of each Contracting Party may operate all cargo services between and beyond the territory of the Contracting Parties without any capacity and frequency restrictions and with full third, fourth and fifth and, subject to approval of the respective aeronautical authorities, seventh freedom traffic rights.

4.4. FIFTH FREEDOM TRAFFIC RIGHTS

The exercise of fifth freedom traffic rights on the specified routes will be subject to agreement between the aeronautical authorities of the two countries.

4.5 COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES

Subject to the approval of the respective aeronautical authorities, each Contracting Party shall grant, on a reciprocal basis, to the designated airline or airlines of the other Contracting Party the right to bring in and maintain in the territory, during a short period, not exceeding ninety(90) days, the additional agents required by the airline(s) of the other Contracting Party for their activities.



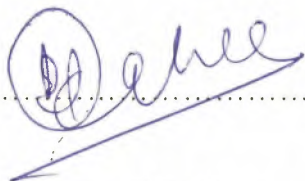
4.6 NON-SCHEDULED (CHARTER) AIR SERVICES

The aeronautical authorities of the Contracting Parties shall give due consideration to any requests from non-scheduled (charter) air services, which may include routings via a third country to the territories of the Contracting Parties or beyond the territories of the Contracting Parties to a third country, or between the territories of the Contracting Parties and a third country.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE

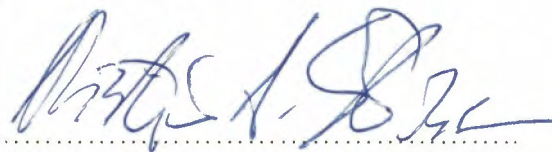
Pending the signature and entry into force of the draft ASA, the two delegations agreed that the provisions of the said draft ASA shall be provisionally applied. The provisions of this MOU shall enter into force with immediate effect from the date of signature.
