

RECORD OF DISCUSSION
ON AIR SERVICES
BETWEEN
THE GOVERNMENT OF ICELAND
AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KENYA

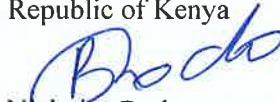
1. Delegations representing the Government of Iceland and the Government of Kenya met in Punta Cana, Dominican Republic at ICAN of ICAO, on the 12th of November 2025 in order to assess their bilateral air transport relations. A list of members of the two Delegations is attached as Annex 1.
2. The discussions were conducted in a friendly and positive atmosphere and both Delegations stressed their interest in expanding mutual relations in the field of air transport.
3. Reference was made to the meeting at ICAN2023 where Delegations of both countries met and the initialled an Air Services Agreement and signed a ROD.
4. The Icelandic Delegation raised the request on the full 7th freedom traffic rights in cargo. The Kenyan Delegation advised on the procedure for applying for 7th freedom traffic right for the designated airline from Iceland.
5. The Icelandic Delegation informed on the possible application from Air Atlanta Icelandic of an Air Service License in Kenya governing non-scheduled international air services in accordance with advice from the Ministry of Road and Transport (State Department for Transport), for the purposes of stable air services to/from Kenya in the future. The Kenyan Delegation advised on such application and the merits of such Air Service License.
6. In their effort to strengthen the relations between their respective Countries in the field of civil aviation, the Delegations agreed that, pending the signature and subsequent entry into force of the ASA, the Aeronautical Authorities of both Parties would apply it administratively pending formal signature.
